Republic Day Celebration

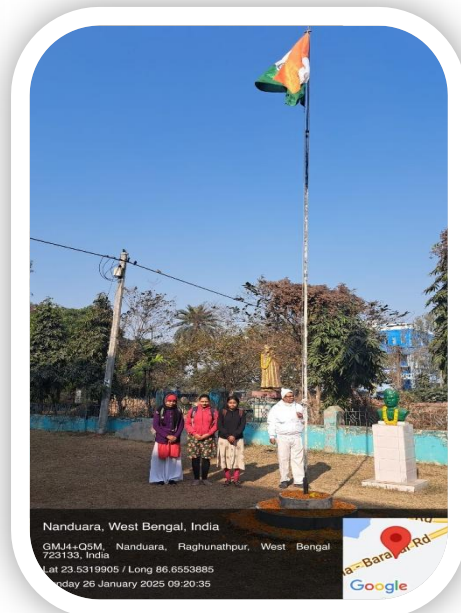
Date: 26th January, 2025

Special Lecture: Indian Freedom Fighters' Struggle in the Freedom Movement

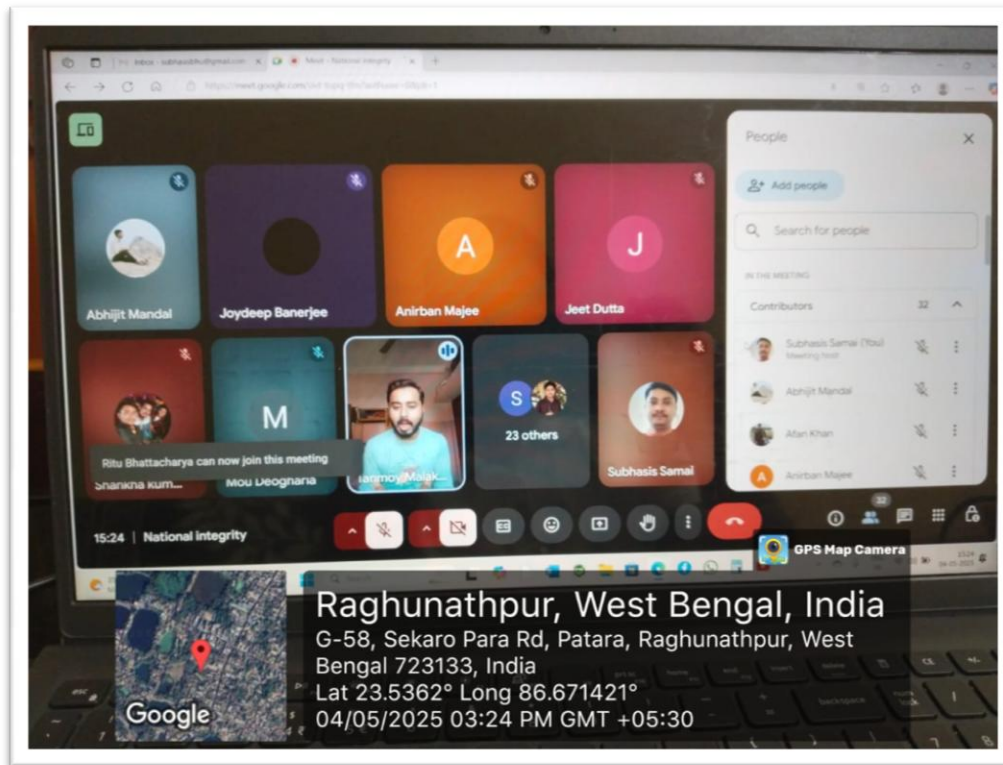
Date: 04.05.2025

Date: 12th March, 2026

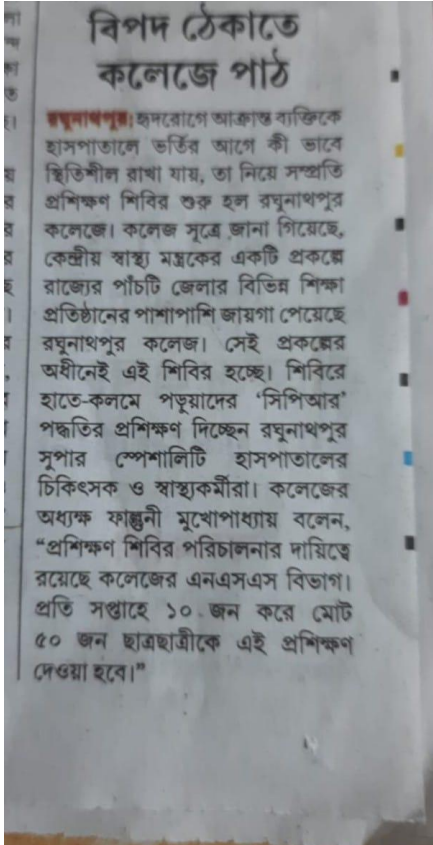
Venue: Raghunathpur College

Online NSS Review Meeting

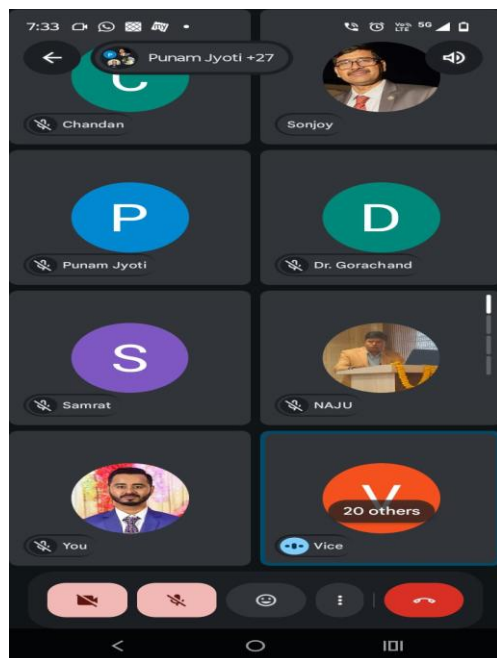
Date: 15th March, 2026

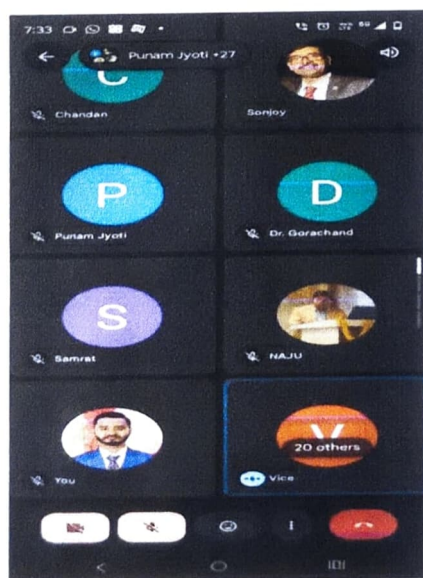
